The Mission:

Location & Campus:

Location: Overlooking Rohini Valley, the School is situated in a pollution-free peaceful environment, 2 kms from Kurseong town.

The Campus : The management believes children need space in which to grow. Our lush, green 5 acre campus comprises of numerous playing fields, two flats, a volley ball court and a basketball court.



Profile

The classrooms : Spacious and equipped with Digital Teaching Technology, the classrooms are adequate, well lit and cleaned daily.



The Science Labs : The three science labs (for Physics, Chemistry and Biology) have recently been shifted to the ISC section.



The Computer lab : An enlarged computer lab with networked computers and colour monitors is supervised by qualified teaching staff.



The School Library: Newly expanded and well-stocked, the library can accommodate one section of students. We encourage our students to read at least one book a week to improve their English language skills.

Academic Performance

St. Anthony's School is noted for 'excellence in education' – Our ICSE candidates (since 1997) have secured a cent percent pass rate. This achievement is because of the effort put in by our dedicated teachers and their scientific approach to student development.

An Academic Cumulative Record is maintained by the Class Teachers (from Classes III to XI) Promotion is decided by the year-long effort put in.

The Academic Year

The Academic Year is divided into four terms. Written exams are held at term ends and a detailed report is handed to parents at a meeting with the Class Teacher.

The final results are posted during the winter vacation.

The closure of the School Office signals the end of the Academic year. The re-opening in early spring begins a new year in the academic cycle of St. Anthony's School.





The Curriculum

Admitted into Class Three, girls and boys are prepared over the years for the ICSE Exam after Class Ten. The ISC section, opened in 2014, will be upgraded to Class Twelve and selected candidates will appear for the ISC Exam in March 2016.

The curriculum is a combination of English (Language and Literature), Second Language (a choice among, Hindi, Bengali or Nepali), History and Civics, Geography, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and Commercial/ Computer Applications.





Co-curricular

To supplement classroom learning, activities are conducted. Outings and excursions break the monotony. Inter-class contests, Elocution (Choral and Individual), Talk a Minute, Debates and Extempore (Public speaking) and Essay-writing are held. At Monday assembly, a declamation is held. Each section, is given a turn to prepare four speakers to speak on selected topics.

Board displays in the classrooms and corridors are organized for special occasions. World Environment Day is celebrated by the St. Anthony's School INTERACT club.

Exhibitions are held, to showcase the creative skills of teachers and students.

Quizzing is a popular co-curricular, introduced in 1993. The School Quiz Team contests at the Inter-School level.

The Annual School Fete (held separately in both sections – Girls' and Boys') is an opportunity for students to organize their stalls, interact with visitors and learn to work together.

In brief, Education offered here is **ACTIVITY-ORIENTED**. 'Learning by doing' is the sound method to give practice and experience to supplement traditional theory.





Infrastructure

Infrastructure has kept pace with the growing years and the ever-increasing needs. The H.B. Tewari Auditorium was constructed to accommodate 600 invitees. School functions, concerts, Musical Fests and Inter-School Meets are held here. The ISC Section is the latest addition.

The specific amenities available are:

St. Anthony's Boarding House

a) Having three dormitories b) A spacious dining hall and c) Infirmary.

a) Clean and adequately spaced out, the dormitories are living quarters for the boarders. The ancillary staff maintain neatness.



b) The catering department cook and serve up nutritious meals. The boarders enjoy these in the redesigned Dining Hall, serviced and cleaned by the ancillaries. Hygiene is strictly followed.

c) The Infirmary – is well equipped and supervised by a nurse and her assistant. A doctor's weekly visit monitors health care. During the week, sick students requiring medical consultation are taken to town. Hair, fingernails and handkerchiefs are inspected after Monday assembly. A health record of each student is maintained, where height and weight is entered every term.

Teaching and Non-teaching staff.



Teachers are our most important asset. Regular orientation programmes are conducted. We have worked hard to build our team of knowledge workers, we are discerning about appointing the right teachers and do not compromise on quality and qualifications. We have a student teacher ratio of 14:1.

Non-teaching staff are equally important. They provide support and are on duty before and after class hours. Games masters teach physical education as well as conduct Inter-House games, coach School Teams (Senior and Junior) in Volleyball, Basketball, Football and Table Tennis for the Inter-School contests.



Counselling & Career Guidance

For classes Ten and Twelve, a Career Assessment is conducted by Anubhav. The Test findings include Aptitude and Interpretation. Classroom Coaching for Entrance Exams (JEE and IIT) will be conducted.



Admission Procedure

New admissions are confined to Classes Three and now Eleven. Provisional admission (after completing the ICSE Examination to Class XI (ISC Course)) can be applied for in April/May.

Admissions to Class Three for the next year's session start in June/July. Only in case of withdrawal in November will admissions to other classes be considered.

No candidate will be admitted without a Transfer Certificate from the last school attended.

Foreign students (from Bangladesh and Thailand) should have a valid visa for the entire academic year, and a current Passport. The same documents are to be deposited in the school Office on reporting for the new Academic year.
